The Origin of The Center Brunswick Methodist
The original Methodist Church was
organized in Dec. 1835.

It was located on the site where Alvin
or Sonny Ginsburg's home is at present.
The members came from Eagle Mills,
Sycaway and East Brunswick, there
were over 300 members at that time.

Later on, the East Brunswick Methodist
Church, the Eagle Mills Methodist Church
and the Sycaway Methodist Church
each started their own church.

It was decided to tear down the
old church and move it down to the
4 Corners in Center Brunswick. This was
done in 1901 and rebuilt but they
changed the architecture, the new
church then was dedicated in 1902.
Rev. William Flouton was the Pastor
at that time.

Our present Parsonage was built in 1873
When Mr. Van DenBroek was here in 1946
The church was raised and a cellar or
Basement was excavated. It was a long
slow process as it was solid Rock.
We now have a beautiful large room that

is used for Church School, Suppers
and entertainments.

In 1954 when Mr Snyder was here we
changed the inside of our Auditorium.
by turning the pulpit and choir
lofts to the side of the church.
The original front is now the ministers
study. The old Auditorium had
chair seats that were fastened to the
floor and went up and down.

Different members of the church
each bought a piece to put in the
newly decorated church. Other members
of the church had relatives and
friends who gave things in memory
of their folks.

There are only four members of our
church who remember and went to the
first church that was up the road
They are Alice Lillfield, Carrie Castle Wade
Helen Smith and my grand father,
Harold Wilson. Helen Smith played the organ
My ^{great} grandmother Cackoon is the
oldest member of this church, she is
Almost 87.
